6<sup>th</sup> June 2024 – **Stephanie Sirr** will speak about **Nottingham Playhouse - A Regional** theatre with an international reach.

Stephanie Sirr MBE has been CEO of Nottingham Playhouse for over 20 years after stints running theatres in Blackpool and Somerset. She will talk us through the highs and lows of running a theatre in a cost of living crisis, tell us how being both the creative factory and the shop keeps the Playhouse a theatre with a regional remit and throw in some unrepeatable anecdotes for good measure.

4<sup>th</sup> July 2024 – **Dr Christine Christie** will give a talk on A Brief History of the English Language.

Christine will survey the languages that have been spoken in Britain and the origins of the English Language to illustrate how it has developed over time.

1<sup>st</sup> August 2024 – **Simon Croson** 'A beekeepers year' Simon will speak about the practise of beekeeping, illustrated with his own beautiful photographs.

5<sup>th</sup> September 2024 – **Chris Matthews** will speak about the **Nottingham Lace Walk.** Manufactured lace had a momentous impact on Nottingham: helping to change a turbulent county town into a modern industrialised municipality. This illustrated talk will show the sheer scale and speed of this change around Nottingham city centre.

3<sup>rd</sup> October 2024 – **Sara Goodacre** is Professor of Evolutionary Biology and Genetics at the University of Nottingham and has appeared on the BBC under the title 'Spiderwoman'. She will speak about her fascinating research about spiders.
